How we evaluate the service that we deliver

- Our Patient Education Service has three staff members all peers with lived experience.
  - Patient Education lead
  - Patient Education assistant
  - Patient Education volunteer
  - Our Patient education assistant has a caseload of 12 patients and concentrates on the educational needs of the older population.
  - Our Patient education volunteer has a caseload of 8 patients and concentrates on the educational needs of short stay admissions.

#### • Inpatient Programme:

- Six week rolling programme of 23 sessions, 13 of which are run by peers. Plus demographic specific discussion groups focusing on lived experience and led by peers.
- Selection process based on admission, patient education screening tool used on high-risk patients (over 65, C4 and higher, English as a second language) to identify specific learning needs.
- One-to-one session selection based on referral from MDT or through screening tool.
- Independent living program (four sessions about living with personal assistants/carers) led by peers.

- Inpatient Programme Evaluation and Follow up:
  - Clear process within education service for identifying missed sessions and gaps in knowledge

- Family and Friends Programme:
  - Relatives day run four times per year, relatives given patient specific handout information
  - Children and siblings day run once a year.

### Future plans for service

#### Future plans for service

 Increase patient education service to five staff members all peers with lived experience 1 Patient Education volunteer and 3 Patient Education assistants


 Increase remit of patient education assistants to focus on a broader demographic such as incomplete patients or walkers and vented/trache patients, as well as over 65's and cauda equina.

#### Future plans for service

- Inpatient Programme:
  - increase in demographic specific groups focusing on who lived experience led by peers.
  - Assess readiness for education.
  - Closer working with assistive technology department for those who wish to learn about their health needs using technology.
  - Separate pathway for identifying and meeting the educational needs of short stay admissions such as Cauda Equina patients

### Effective peers

CARF accreditation

The spinal cord specialty program implements written procedures for the recruitment of peer supporters.

The spinal cord specialty program provides peer support services that:

- a. Reflect the characteristics of the persons served.
- b. Address the preferences and choices of the persons served.
- c. Address the needs of the persons served.

- 19. Peer supporters receive documented competency based training that:
- a. Is based on a peer support curriculum or a curriculum designed and developed with the input of peer supporters [ex. ISCOS (under education committee), amputee coalition]
- b. Is provided with the involvement of peer supporters, as appropriate.
  - c. Includes:
- (1) Initial training on current practices in peer support services [ex: community resources, engagement, effective use of sharing life experiences, personal advocacy, adjustment to disability]
- (2) Ongoing training on current practices in peer support services.
  - d. Is provided in a manner that is understandable

20. The program demonstrates efforts to include peer supporters in the rehabilitation process of the persons served. [ex: team meetings, education for persons served]






#### Attendance to core sessions





# How has Spinal Cord Injury Education has made you feel confident about managing your SCI?







## How likely are you to recommend Spinal Cord Injury Education to others




# Do you confidently understand your diagnosis and prognosis?




# Are you confident you could manage an episode of Autonomic Dysreflexia?




#### Confidence scales
